

## Vision Statement

As enabled by the Holy Spirit, within the next five years (2020), CCBC will truly become a Great Commission Church as evidenced by both our words and our actions.

## Mission Statement

CCBC will actively share the Gospel message with unreached people locally, within our state, our nation, internationally through both Christ-centered, Biblically-based mission organizations (conforming to our Statement of Faith) and our own church-based mission activities, both sending and supporting missionaries in various capacities.

## Strategic Goals

- Effectively communicate the Biblical mandate for sharing the gospel so that the leadership and congregation of CCBC will enthusiastically support our commitment as a Great Commission church.
- Through direct or IMB partnership opportunities, we will send and support two international missionaries.
- CCBC will see its first home-grown, full-time missionary placed in the field.
- We will organize and support congregational participation in annual short term mission trips.
- CCBC students/young people will participate in all types of mission trips on an individual basis and will have the opportunity for an annual group mission experience in the United States or in a foreign country.
- CCBC will transition its five year commitment to the eastern Pwo Karen in a manner that provides continuity and security in the spread of the Gospel to that region.
- CCBC will seek God's leading in identifying a new unreached people group for another five-year mission commitment, to begin in 2017.
- The CCBC family will financially support the strategic goals through a prospective 20-25% allocation of the CCBC General Fund Mission Budget, the Annie Armstrong and Lottie Moon offerings and other offerings to missions.

## Church Plant in Myanmar

CCBC's local evangelist/pastor is Job who lives in Dawei, Myanmar. In response to the mission team and the leadership of CCBC, we have approached Job about the possibility of partnering with him to create a church plant in Myanmar. Job has worked as a translator for CCBC teams when we are in Myanmar providing instruction, and he also serves as a contact regarding the continuing work in our absence. In addition, Job serves as a traveling evangelist in Dawei and the surrounding area, where CCBC has held Bible training for Myanmar believers over the past several years.

His purpose as written in his own words is, "I hope the Lord will allow us to reap what we are sowing, the Seed of Gospel in the hearts of unbelievers. As we celebrate in two villages a lot of adults come and pay attention to our delivery of the Gospel. In fact some of them confess that they accept Jesus Christ as their Savior when I make invitation, but only one woman took water baptism. We just sow the seeds, but only the Holy Spirit can make it increase."

Job is currently involved in the following activities:

- Preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ to Buddhist Pwo Karen in Dawei and the surrounding area, serving them a meal, and giving them Christmas gifts.
- Preaching the Gospel to the Pwo Karen Buddhist in other regional villages.
- Visiting a village which is 47miles far from Dawei Township and staying in a tiny tent to help the work of a village in the daytime and preach the Gospel in the evening.
- Starting a church planting at Pakawzon village.

The villagers had worshipped in the house of U Hla Win there every week. But now they are prohibited gathering together there; so they are seeking a new location.



*How we can be involved? Please pray for U Hla Win and his wife so that they may not be expelled from their work and their house. Pray for all the believers at Pakawzon village to be strong in their faith as they search for a place to worship every Sunday. In addition please pray for Job as he faces the attacks of Satan who tries to thwart his work of spreading of the Gospel in Myanmar. CCBC is offering financial support for a church plant in Pakawzon village as well as some of Job's other evangelistic endeavors. # Unreached People Groups - Myanmar

Patrick and Diana Williams make Semi-annual mission trips to Myanmar to train local church leaders. CCBC has a five-year commitment with the Eastern Pwo Karen people in Myanmar. We are now in our fifth year of work. The Eastern Pwo Karen people are considered to be an unreached people group. It is estimated that there are only about 250-500 born-again believers in this group of some 750,000 people whose major religion is Buddhism. Our church is involved with teaching pastors, church leaders and others how to take the gospel to a lost and dying world. It is the Eastern Pwo Karen who must take the gospel to the world around them.

Our main goal is to leave a "footprint" behind us by training local believers who have a compelling desire to reach the lost how to plant evangelical churches in southern Myanmar. We are equipping these few believers with the tools necessary to evangelize the lost and to disciple new believers. All of the teaching work we do here is translated into the written Burmese language as these people have very little written information about God's Word. Teams from CCBC will be going to Myanmar April 28-May 9 and October 6-17, 2016. We are to make disciples and we are to teach them what Jesus commanded.

## Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Ministry

Operation Christmas Child (OCC) is an outreach ministry of Samaritans Purse run by Billy Graham's son Franklin. At Christmas, OCC sends shoeboxes containing small items such as hygiene items, school supplies, small toys, hats, socks and shoes to children who have probably never heard the name of Jesus. Through 2014, about 120,000,000 children have received shoeboxes worldwide, each representing up to 9 presentations of the Gospel. One third of these children accept Jesus as Savior, adding 40 million new members to the Kingdom of God. Due to a shortage of shoeboxes, 1.8 billion children leave empty handed.

As part of the Children's Ministry at CCBC, OCC allows church members to get involved in the great commission, "go to all nations" without traveling to foreign countries. Empty boxes and information are available starting in November to take home and pack. Throughout the year, the Children's Ministry collects items for a church-wide Packing Party held in November. The completed boxes are then delivered to the area collection site in Morehead City.

# Global Health Outreach Medical Missions

Global Health Outreach (GHO) is the division of the Christian Medical and Dental Association dedicated to providing both medical care and spiritual healing to people of third world countries around the globe through short-term mission trips. These medical mission trips, staffed by doctors, dentists, pharmacists, nurses and logistical support volunteers, are assisted by a team of local Christian interpreters to minister to the needs of people in impoverished areas. The patients hear the gospel message at every step in the process; by the local pastors when they apply for care through a local church, by the nurses during triage, when receiving treatment by the doctors and dentists and during special church services held during the week. In addition, their children get to participate in a vacation Bible school program while the patient is waiting for treatment.

CCBC has had a number of members join trips to Nicaragua and El Salvador over the past 5 years. This is a great opportunity for anyone being called to “taste” short-term international missions in a safe, well organized and friendly environment, with local friends and family.

# New Tribes Missions in Papua New Guinea

NEW TRIBES MISSION (NTM) is a faith based missionary organization that sends missionaries to unreached tribal groups who do not have a written language. The goal of NTM is to create a written language, teach the people how to read and write it, translate the bible into the tribal language, and plant an indigenous church. The missionaries must raise 100% of their support, unlike Baptist missionaries with the IMB.

After a year and a half of training, missionaries Jessi and John Michael raised their support and moved the family to Papua New Guinea (PNG) in 2011. Once they learned the national language and were assigned to the Hewa tribe, they moved into their village of approximately 100 people, built their homes from the ground up and began learning the tribal language.

The missionaries teach the villagers the Good News using the Creation to Christ method evangelizing the tribal people. Jessi and John Michael's village has an established church which needs to be discipled; most of their villagers are new believers, and have begun to share the Good News in surrounding villages. Bible translation work is in progress.

*Opportunities for CCBC to get involved with this mission include prayer support (many of our members already pray for them) and building a medical clinic. The materials are already provided; volunteers would simply need to pay for travel. Round trip airfare is approximately \$2900 -- \$4000. For students, a week at FUGE camp is exciting, fun, loud, and sometimes even messy. But those things don't bring about life-change on their own. Every moment spent at FUGE is intentional. Camp programming is designed to take students out of their normal routine and place them into an environment that is focused on life-change through relationship with Christ.

## **Centrifuge**

At Centrifuge, students are divided into groups for recreation and Bible study based on age ranges by grade completed. Recreation is facilitated within Bible study groups by a member of our trained FUGE camp staff. Each activity serves a specific purpose and is debriefed so students can make application in their lives. Students also participate in Track Times which are designed to give students an opportunity to participate in something with which they are familiar, or try something new! Students are divided into "tracks" based on a list of activities they indicate during the registration process. We offer creative, active, performance, and classroom-based activities led by a member of the FUGE staff.

## **Church Group Time**

Those who go as student leaders will be allotted time and a space to gather with their students to unpack the way the Lord is working in their lives. We offer materials to help facilitate this time.

## BackPack Friends

BackPack Friends provides nutritional meals and snacks to children who may need a little extra over the weekend. By supplying these bags, our goal is to assist in meeting their nutritional, mental and overall well-being needs. We need your help!! The number of children in need is growing on a daily basis so we need your continued support. Now in our fifth year, BackPack Friends delivers over 250 backpacks of food to children in 11 schools throughout Carteret, Onslow and Jones counties each week; all packed by caring volunteers with 100% donated food supplies at an annual cost of \$80,000.

BackPack Friends targets kids who access free and reduced-price breakfasts and lunches at school. Children are identified as "in-need" by school guidance counselors and site coordinators. Backpacks are filled with healthy foods and are discreetly distributed to children before weekends or holiday vacations and empty backpacks are recollected and refilled for the next weekend's use. The Second Sunday of each month has been designated as BackPack Friends Donation Sunday. For a complete list of items needed, flyers are available at the Welcome Center.

### How you can help:

1. Hold a BackPack Friends food drive with your group at your office, club or neighborhood. New backpacks are welcome!
2. Adopt backpacks for a month, semester or year. Purchase food weekly and fill the backpacks. Drop the backpacks off at Cape Carteret Baptist Church or arrange for them to be picked up.
3. Volunteer. Come to the Food Storage Locker to help pack backpacks or help deliver them to the schools!

FISH is intended to complement, not replace, other twelve-step groups. While many of the principles and traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous and other 12-step programs are incorporated, the FISH Group combines recovery and spirituality as an effective way to work a twelve-step program. It introduces people to Christ-centered recovery with the spiritual truths of the Bible. Group members do not give direction or advice to other members. Instead, they share their personal experiences and stories. The Group respects the confidentiality and anonymity of each person.

Opportunities to become involved are listed below:

- Serve as a sponsor or accountability partner to help others in recovery. Previous involvement in a 12-step program (AA, Alanon, NA, OA, GA, CR, etc.) is required.
- Serve as a spiritual mentor. Meet one on one with members of the same gender, or with a small group, for fellowship, bible study, and worship.
- Serve as volunteer to pick up and return home persons needing rides to FISH Group meetings.
- FISH Group welcomes you to attend the meetings held at CCBC, each Sunday at 5:00 p.m., if you have been affected by addictions yourself or affected by someone else's addictions.

A ship is the most efficient platform to deliver a state-of-the-art-hospital to regions where clean water, electricity, medical facilities and skilled personnel are limited or nonexistent. More than 75% of the world's population lives within 100 miles of a port city. The Eldridge's began with a division of Mercy Ship called Mercy Teams that serves inland communities; they went to Honduras. In 2007 they started taking medical teams to Benin, West Africa, and in 2009 they began leading teams there on their own; they went to Northwest Haiti Christian Mission's hospital in Haiti.
